Criteria for the medical/psychological/psycho-educational/multidisciplinary report

Baccalaureate Cycle

Be up to date. The report must not be more than two years old at the time of the filing of the request, i.e. should not be dated earlier than October 2018. It is nevertheless recommended – whenever possible- to have a report established at the end of the S4 school year.

Be legible. On headed paper, signed and dated

Be written in English, French or German. If it was not written in one of these languages, the report must be accompanied by a translation into French, English or German.

State the title, name and professional credentials of the expert(s) who has/have undertaken the evaluation and diagnosis of the pupil.

In order to avoid possible conflict of interests, the expert assessing pupils will be neither an employee of the European School nor a relative of the pupil.

State specifically the nature of the pupil's medical and/or psychological needs and the tests or techniques used to arrive at the diagnosis.

Report for learning disorders need to describe the pupil's strengths and difficulties (cognitive assessment) and their impact on learning (educational evidence).

Report for medical/psychological issues need to specify the pupil's medical/psychological needs and their impact on learning (educational evidence).

Be accompanied by a clear diagnosis according to DSM-5 or ICD-10.

Contain recommendations that must be defined precisely (extra time, use of computer, etc.).

Note: The codes of the special arrangements that can be granted as well as their description are indicated in the request form (see Appendix 1)
